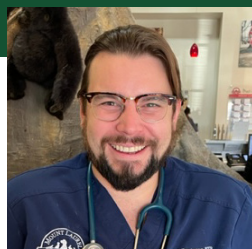
Dr. Jane Jones

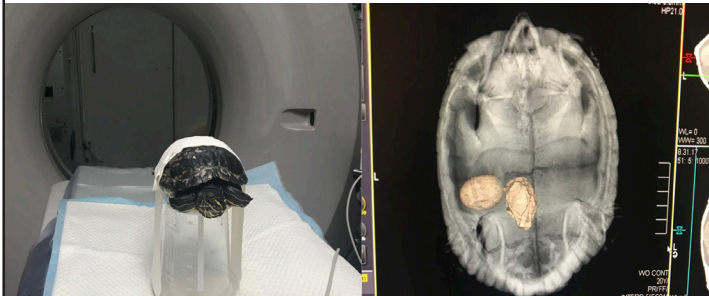
